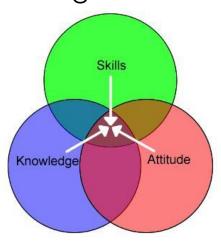


Grand Canyon Chapter's Mission

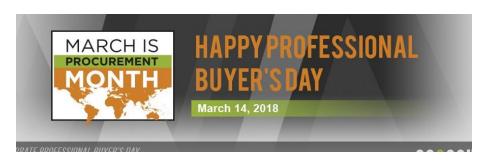
Procurement Month

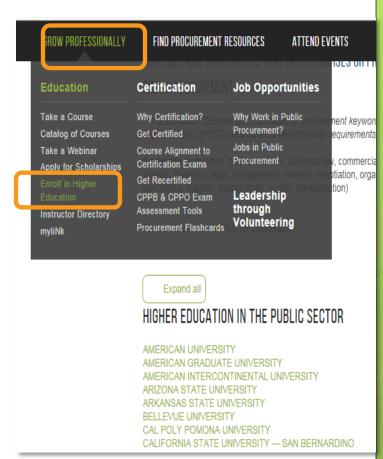

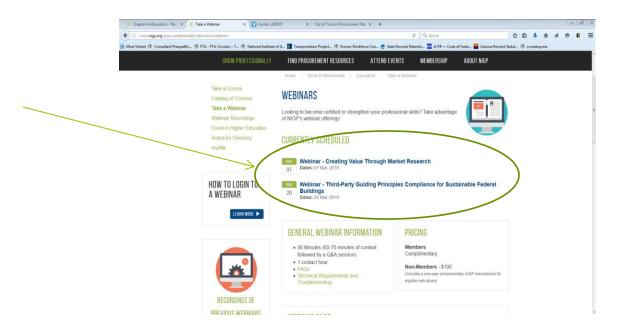

CPPB

CPPB Eligibility Requirements

- Associate's Degree
- Coursework/Training can be satisfied through the completion of 1 of the following 3 options:
 - 3 credit hours of public procurement coursework AND 56 contact hours of "instructor-led" procurement training/education,
 - 6 credit hours of procurement-related coursework AND 56 contact hours of "instructor-led" procurement training/education,
 - 158 contact hours of "instructor-led" procurement training/education.
- 3 years of public procurement experience completed within the previous ten (10) years.

CPPO

CPPO Eligibility Requirements

- Bachelor's Degree
- Coursework/Training can be satisfied through the completion of 1 of the following 3 options:
 - 3 credit hours of public procurement coursework AND 72 contact hours of "instructor-led" procurement training/education,
 - 6 credit hours of procurement-related coursework AND 72 contact hours of "instructor-led" procurement training/education,
 - 174 contact hours of "instructor-led" procurement training/education.
- 5 years of public procurement experience completed within the previous ten (10) years of which a minimum of 3 years is in a management or supervisory position

 - Intended for business professionals responsible for supplier diversity and strategic diversity initiatives within the organization.

CPSM Eligibility Requirements

- Three years of full-time supply management experience (nonclerical, nonsupport) and a regionally accredited bachelor's degree, OR
- Five years of full-time supply management experience (nonclerical, nonsupport)

- Exam 2 Effective Supply Management Performance
- Exam 3 Leadership in Supply Management

CPSD

CPSD Eligibility Requirements

- Three years of supplier diversity or supply management experience (nonclerical, nonsupport) and have a regionally accredited bachelor's degree, OR
- Five years of supplier diversity or supply management experience (nonclerical, nonsupport)

Exams

- Earning a CPSD requires you to pass either one or two exams depending on whether or not you already have a CPSM or C.P.M. certification. You may take the following two exams in any order:
 - Foundation of Supply Management CPSD Exam 1 (this exam is waived if you currently have a CPSM or C.P.M.)
 - Essentials in Supplier Diversity CPSD Exam 2
